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the provision of catering and cleaning by the end of August. We have put the catering contract out to tender through a procurement agency along with 10 other South Glos primary schools and are going through the process and awaiting bids. We are looking at getting a quote for cleaning through Bristol City Council and looking at the costs of employing the cleaning staff directly

Q: Do I assume that current budget covers catering costs?

A: We get a grant for the provision of UIFSM and the provision of FSM's is in the funding formula. Parents pay for KS2 meals

Q: Do a lot of children Y3-6 have school meals?

A: Not many, we could do with this increasing

Q: Is there a LA vision paper? What is their 2 or 3 year plan?

A: Not that we know of. In 3 years' time their funding will be at 25% of what it was so they will probably only be able to meet their statutory duties around assessment and SEND

 St Peter's could get left behind if the rest of the Bridge FOS forms a trust but we are not able to join due to Methodist church not giving go ahead

6 Headteachers Report (including Feedback from LA review, Inspection Data Summary Report and Rapid School Improvement Plan review)

Documents circulated in advance of meeting Documents displayed on screen

- Children have been doing assessments this week. Phonics is being carried out this and next week but it is looking strong. 5 out of 7 Y2 children have now reached threshold. We have 7 children in Y1 (out of 13) who have already met the threshold
- A lot more focused work on Q of E since last LA review (and this report was written)
- LA Review lack of usual staff in KS1 on the day meant the day was not a fair reflection of progress made
- Report only received last week and contained errors
- Since review LC has made a really clear plan for everyone, step by step short action plan. PS and Nic B-M have been dropping in to phonics lessons every week. One teacher teaching phonics lesson every day making it consistent. Megan Bell & Cat Daly have been to Almondsbury to see ELS phonics. They are also scheduled to visit a school near Cinderford soon. LC will also attend
- Next review is second week after Easter
- NS offered to attend review meeting
- More in house training with TA's has taken place
- We've also looked humanities
- Next review will be looking at History
- Attendance still strong and above national average with persistent absence lower than last year and nat av
- Persistent absence is being tackled with SAM meetings and letters
- Pupil numbers going down
- Finally been sent safeguarding audit to complete
- Looked at adaptive teaching



- Autism training and autism bucket training have also taken place
- Parents evenings completed
- Had another Bridge FOS steering group meeting which looked at proposed leadership strategy and due diligence. Next meeting being held next week and due diligence will be looked at further. This information will then come back to each individual governing body
- Q: Is there anything we can do about the Methodist church situation and finding the articles?

A: Not really at the moment. MO will make contact with and speak to other 2 joint Methodist/Anglican schools in the area regarding their views

- Rev Teddy is being appointed to the governing board by Methodist church which is good news (PS had email from Adam Biddlestone).
- PS is going to speak with 4 other schools governing bodies about possibly of joining Bridge FOS and 2 other Headteachers
- Partnership Steering group agreed for partnership agreement to be continued for another year

Q: Is there any other option?

A: Both schools feel they are getting value from the partnership

Decision – All governors agreed they were in favour of continuing
with partnership agreement for another year

Q: Has she got experience of working in a mixed age class?

Q: Did I read that the numbers are low for September?

A: 13 first choice applications were received so yes. There has been 1 deferral request. Other schools quite locally oversubscribed so we may pick up more. We will be notified of final number during Easter holidays

Inspection Data Summary Report

- This is the data that inspectors see
- Where nothing is highlighted, we are around the national average.
- The data is on last year's results. Phonics was flagged but we know we have made huge progress on this since last year. There was nothing else there in terms of other attainment records
- Persistent absence has decreased since last year so we are doing better
- Suspensions were high, all attributed to 1 child. This number has reduced since
- KS1 reading score was low but maths in top 20%
- KS2 writing was in top 20%
- There is real difference in ability with Maths and English in current vear 3
- We know that current Y6 cohort are not as able as last years

- A: The overarching policy is that all schools must be part of a Methodist controlled or Anglican trust. The chances of moving Methodist church policy within next 6 months are not likely. PS has spoken to the RDD about the situation and there may some pressure from that direction. We are making progress in general direction of doing the best for the children. It's important that we keep focusing on making our decision based on the best interests for the school and children
- PS is also speaking to Diocese of Bristol (DBAT) and Bridge FOS governors have been invited to their development day and we are talking about possibility of using their central services
