11	Headteachers Report (including KS2 Outcomes, Insight Attainment report, Rapid School Improvement Action Plan 2022-23) Documents circulated in advance of meeting Insight report shows where attainment moved from one area to another and can see the progress children made across the year The previous discrepancy with the data means that some figures had to be adjusted. Overall, we are happy with how children have progressed and developed as gone through the year The Year 6 data doesn't reflect where the SATs came out at (apart from Maths which is similar) Does this (Insight) data go with the children to secondary school? A: No, it's just used internally for us to track progress We are moving our data tracking to Arbor from this term Will it still report in a similar way to this? A: Yes, it will be something similar Y6 SATs results were disappointing and were down on what we expected and from targets, the outcomes were really low and not as positive as our predictions were, especially in Maths. One child's paper has gone to be remarked so hopefully figure will increase to 44% NBM is going to write a case study regarding that cohort. Apart from in Y1 they had changes of teachers within the year every year. There was also high SEND - almost a third. 2 children were disapplied from the test but they are still counted in the numbers Every term of practise SATs paper there were a number of children just on the edge i.e. 97/98 score so we hoped they would achieve in the actual tests but didn't unfortunately How did the LA fare? A: A lot better than we did. KS2 Outcomes 2022-23 document was displayed on screen Ignore wrong year and pupil numbers at top PS ran through our school scores compared to LA and National averages (National figure shown is last year's, that has now dropped to 69% for reading) The results are disappointing and much lower than where we wanted to be What does this year's cohort look like?
