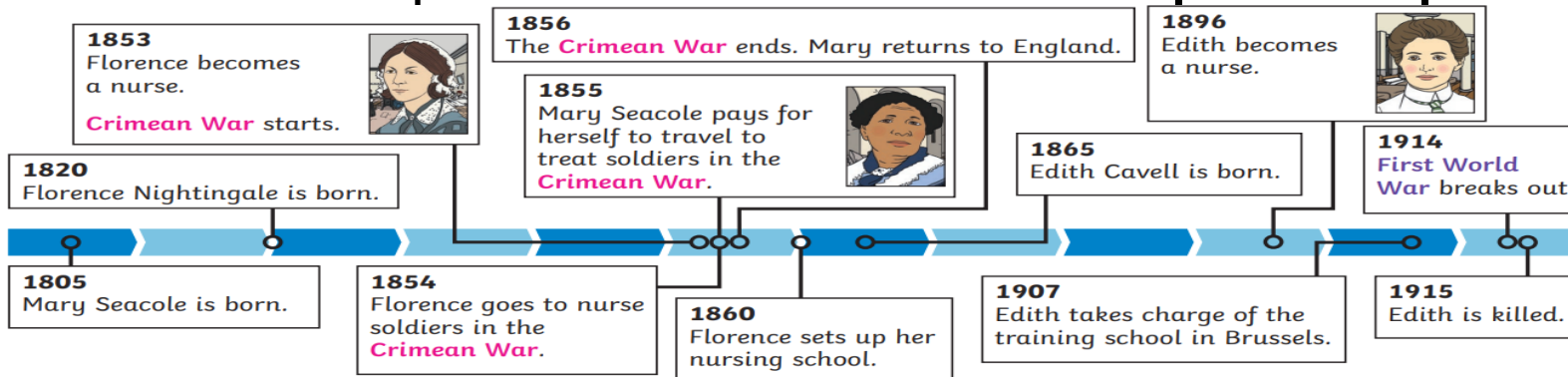

History

Mary Seacole is famous for travelling to the Crimean war in 1855 to help soldiers receive medical care. They called her Mother Seacole. She was born in Kingston Jamaica in 1805. Her mother was a Jamaican doctress (healer) and her father a Scottish soldier. She learnt about herbal remedies from her mother .

Mary travelled to London to seek funding to aid Florence Nightingale with her work helping soldiers. Her offer to help was turned down, likely because she was black.

Seacole paid for herself to go to Crimea and set up a hospital called 'The British Hotel'. She advocated the need for hygiene to treat the sick and injured .

Geography

Jamaica is an Island (Like the UK). It is part of the Caribbean, off the coast of North America.

Jamaica was a British colony until 1962. This means that decisions were made for them.

Jamaica is a tropical island. It is hot and humid. A lot of produce is grown there such as bananas, coffee and sugar.

Position and direction: where is Jamaica on the map?



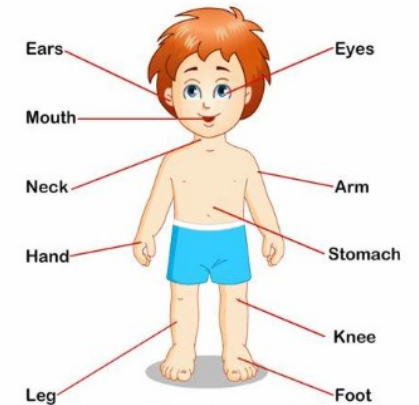
Science
