Parent Governor Vacancies

Dear Parent/Guardian

This letter invites Parents/Guardians of pupils at this school to consider standing for election as a parent governor. There are currently 2 vacancies for parent governors, which we need to fill as soon as possible.

School governing boards must have at least 2 parent governors, who are elected by and from the parents of pupils currently attending their school. Parent governors serve a four year term of office and bring a very important and valued perspective to the work of the governing board.

Before you decide, you may want to know more about what is involved. Experience has shown that governors need a strong commitment to the role and to improving outcomes for children, the inquisitiveness to question and analyse, and the willingness to learn. Governors need not be experts in the field of education; the skills you have can be very useful to the governing board. At the moment the governing board could be strengthened by recruiting governors who have expertise in:

- Finance
- Premises/facilities management
- Human Resources
- General knowledge or experience of being a governor/trustee in another school.
- Being a board member in another sector.
- Experience of strategic planning and translating a vision into clear objectives.

If you are someone with the desired skills or relevant experience, would you consider applying? If you don't have those skills we are still keen to hear from you, Governors also need what is known as 'soft skills' – the ability to be able to build relationships with a range of people, to be able to work as part of a team, to be able to question, and to make connections between different types of information.

Our governing board expects governors to:

- attend six termly meetings of the full governing board;
- sit on a subcommittee and attend the meetings which are usually once a term;
- visit the school formally for monitoring purposes at least twice a year;
- commit to attend induction training and other relevant training courses.

In return, our governing board commits to:

- provide you with an induction;
- provide access to quality training;
- provide you with an experienced governor as mentor;
- provide informal feedback on your contribution to the governing board on a bi-annual basis.

This works out at around eight to ten hours commitment a term. Being a school governor is a voluntary role. Your employer may give you time off to support school governor activities – but they do not have to pay you for it. Check with your management or HR department.

Please note that all governor appointments are subject to an enhanced criminal records check in addition to the Qualifications and Disqualifications Regulations which can be provided on request.

If you would like to put yourself forward as a candidate, please complete and return the attached documents to the school by Friday 19 September 2025 at 3pm.

Your nomination should be accompanied by a succinct personal statement which should include:

- evidence of the extent to which you possess the skills and experience the governing board desires;
- your commitment to undertake training to acquire or develop the skills to be an effective governor;
- if seeking re-election, details of your contribution to the work of the governing board during their previous term of office; and
- how you plan to contribute to the future work of the governing board.

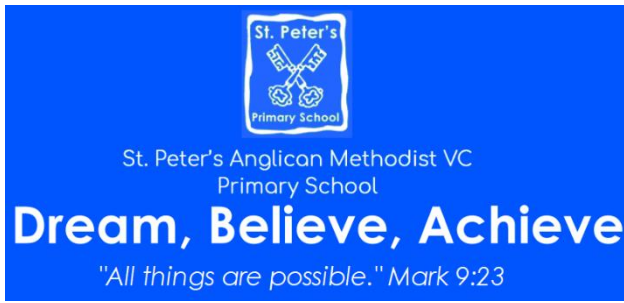
If it is necessary for there to be an election, we will contact you to let you know about the arrangements.
