**Topic:** Our topic for this term will be 'Evolution and Inheritance: What if Darwin never existed?' **Homework:** This will continue to be handed out on a Friday to be handed in the following week. Please remember that learning times tables (as appropriate), spellings and reading are always part of the homework.

**Photographs:** As part of our science/ topic learning, we will be considering what characteristics and physical attributes we may have inherited from our parents. It would be fantastic if the children could bring a photo of themselves with their family to be used in our lesson next Tuesday (12<sup>th</sup> November). We will be happy to photocopy any photos that need to be returned at the end of the day.

**National year 6 assessment week:** Please note this takes place on the week beginning 13<sup>th</sup> May 2018.

The children in Class 6 have really impressed me with the way they have taken on Year 6 responsibilities, including buddying our new Reception children. They are a really great team and I'm sure we will work together to have another excellent term.
