Dear Parents/Carers

Year 4 Newsletter-Term 3

Maths	This term we will study fractions. We will look at equivalent fractions, adding fractions and problem solving with fractions. Please continue to use timestable rockstars, if you need another copy of your child's password or user name, please let me know.
Topic	Our topic this term is 'What if we found an Egyptian Tomb' This lends itself to both a historical topic and plenty of writing opportunities. We will look at key historical figures and learn the chronological order of important times and peoples. This is continued from last term.
English	This term we will look at a new book in our English and guided reading lessons, 'A Series of Unfortunate Events' by Lemony Snicket. We will read the first book and look at sections of the film to create our own story in the style of the author.
RE and SMSC	There will be a weekly Religious Education lesson, our theme this term is 'What significant journeys have we been on?' There will also be a Jigsaw lesson, this may take the form of circle time, a question and answer session or maybe a quiet time. It will be flexible and could incorporate any issues arising in class at the time.
PE	Our PE lessons are as follows: Real PE: Cognitive Skills Gymnastics Children will need suitable clothing for indoor and outdoor PE and this should be kept in school through the term. If possible, we would recommend wearing trainers for PE instead of daps, as they provide better support, especially for games activities. All jewellery needs to be removed for PE sessions (including ear-rings). Newly pierced ears can be taped up with tape provided from home.
Reading	At St Peter's we are having a push on reading. All children will need their reading record and reading book daily as the children have opportunity to read during the day and therefore it is important that they choose a suitable book that is challenging and engaging. If a library book becomes lost, please write me a short note so that I can take it off the computer system.
