Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

Welcome back. I hope you have all enjoyed the summer break. Our termly newsletter will keep you updated on what we will be getting up to during each term. This term, Class 4 will be taught by Mr Buckley on a Wednesday morning and Mr Hunt the rest of the week. Mrs Cole will be working alongside us in class throughout the week.

Topic: Our topic this term is 'What if we found an Egyptian Tomb' This lends itself to both a historical topic and plenty of writing opportunities. We will look at key historical figures and learn the chronological order of important times and peoples.

Homework: The Pick 'n' Mix homework will be added to Class four's Google Classroom page. As ever, these activities are optional and designed to engage your children with our class topic. You are welcome to try as many or as few of them as you like. We encourage children to upload learning to Google Classroom so that we can share with the class throughout the term.

Spellings will be issued on a Friday with children being tested the following week. Children will also take part in the 'Times Table Rockstars' and will be tested on a Friday. You can help support your child's learning by practising spellings and times tables with them regularly.

PE: PE lessons will take place all afternoon on a Wednesday this term. These sessions will be outside and we will be focusing on developing our control, skill and teamwork within the game of Cricket. Please make sure your child wears their kit to school, which will comprise of a white top, black shorts or jogging bottoms and a black hooded top or school jumper/cardigan. They can wear trainers into school if preferred. Please bring in a labelled water bottle each day.

Reading: It is crucial that your children keep up reading outside of school. They will bring home reading books in their book bag, so this is a good place to start. However, it is important to stress that children should be encouraged to read anything that captures their imagination! This can include magazines, comics or books from home.
