

Dear Parents and Children,

Welcome back! It has been lovely to have the children back in school and we have had a fantastic first week. The children have settled in well and have engaged themselves with our learning.

In maths, after parking it during home learning, we have restarted our fractions topic. The children have been working really hard and it's great to see them collaborating with their learning. In English, we have been reading 'The boy, the mole, the fox and the horse' by Charlie Mackesy (see picture). We have been reflecting on quotes in the book and it has inspired our writing. During our afternoon lessons, to settle the children back in, we have taken part in an art project. Then, in the coming weeks we will continue our learning on the Industrial Revolution and how this relates to Bristol over the next few weeks.



This term, PE will be taught by myself on a Monday afternoon and Bristol Sport Coaches on a Thursday afternoon. Similarly to last term, please can children come to school wearing their PE kit. Please ensure children are wearing suitable clothing for outdoor PE. All jewelry must be removed for PE sessions. Newly pierced ears must be taped up with tape provided from home. Children should also bring in a water bottle every day that will be stored in our classroom sink area.

Please can I remind all children and families that all children should be reading and have their reading record signed at least 3 times a week. Regular reading, even if for 5-10 minutes every night, will have a significant impact on their development. You can find inspiration for appropriate and quality books by having a look on Google Classroom, under the tab 'Reading'. I have also uploaded some documents that provide some support on what questions to ask your child when they are reading.

Finally, I would like to thank you for your continued support during the period of home learning. I understand that it must have been difficult at times but everyone at school appreciates everything that you have done. I understand that the new restrictions make it difficult for you to catch me at the end of the day with any questions.
