Thank you children and parents for all your hard work with the home learning. I have been impressed with the quality as well as quantity of work produced. The children have settled well back into class and have hit the road running and settled well back into the routine where they have displayed an excellent hardworking learning attitude.

English – In our English lessons we will continue to read 'Floodland' by Marcus Sedgwick and will be writing narrative, letters and persuasion texts.

Mathematics: Over the last few weeks of term our topic will be algebra where we will be describing patterns, finding the nth term, solving equations and using formula.

Geography: This term we will continue our focus on North America where the focus will be specifically on USA and the different regions as well as geographical features.

Science: We will continue our Evolution and Inheritance topic where we will learn about adaptation, inheritance and evolution.

PE: PE will take place on Tuesday and Thursday and children will need to wear their school PE kit in to school on those days. In line with our school uniform policy, this should consist of black or grey shorts, a white t-shirt, black tracksuit bottoms. Children can also wear their school jumper or cardigan when outside. If they are unable to do PE for any reason, children will need to bring in a signed note or an email can be sent to the office which will be forwarded to me.

Reading: It is vital that the children read regularly (ideally every day) and are encouraged to choose reading material that they are interested. Children will be given time to choose books in school and they will take these home to read. They are very welcome to bring in their own books from home if they are appropriately challenging. Please ensure that they complete their reading records and get you to sign them each time they have read. Reading records and reading books should be taken home and returned to school every day.
