

Dear Parents, Carers and Children,

Welcome back to term 5! We hope that you had a lovely Easter break and you are ready for another term full of exciting learning. Please also make sure you take a look at this term's topic map which will give you a bit of an insight into this term's learning.

**Topic:** This term our 'Curious Curriculum' enquiry will be "What will we find in the garden?". Please see an attached overview of the planned activities, although this will continue to evolve alongside the children's learning and interests.

**Daily routine:** Please note that in Reception the timetable often changes during the week to evolve around the children and also school events. We will be continuing to greet the children each morning from the entrance of the school, please continue to allow your children to be as independent as possible when joining the line each morning. Please be advised that our guidance is that only **one parent/carer** should be allowed on site to collect their child and a face covering must be worn. The one way system will still be in place.

**Staying active:** This term P.E. will take place on a Monday afternoon with the Forever Sports coaches and we will be doing a outdoor learning session each Wednesday afternoon. Please ensure that your child wears appropriate PE kit each Monday and Wednesday. On Wednesdays please ensure your children are wearing appropriate footwear that you do not mind getting muddy! We will also take part in daily mindfulness sessions such as class yoga.



**Outdoor Learning:** We continue to encourage the children to explore the outdoor classroom and outdoor surroundings on a daily basis. If you would like your child to have wellies/overalls send them in whenever possible, these can be kept in the classroom if you would like.

**In school reading and changing books:** Please ensure that your child brings their reading book and reading diary into school everyday. This is important to ensure that they have the resources with them for an adult to read with them within the school week. We will be changing books each **Friday**. Please could you remind your child to put their bookbag or reading folder in the reading boxes each morning (we will also remind the children each morning when putting their belongings away) this will ensure every child's book is changed and nobody misses out!

\*The reading boxes are just a pink and a blue box we keep all reading folders/bags in to save space by the children's pegs as it can be a squeeze!

**Tapestry:** Tapestry is a fantastic way for you to see what your child has been learning or choosing in school. It is also a fantastic way for Miss Daly, Mr Buckley and I to see the fantastic learning or family activities you have been doing at home. Please continue to share your own observations on Tapestry as we love to see them and the children really enjoy sharing what they have been doing at home with us!

**Home tasks:** Please continue to read daily with your child and please record this in your child's white reading diary. We ask that you read **at least three times per week** with your child. Before reading your child's reading book it is also recommended that you practise saying each sound in your child's yellow sound book and practising any sounds they are finding tricky! It is also important to ask your child questions about their book and what they have read – some examples are below for your information:
